# LANDSCAPING FOR NEXT YEAR AND BUDGET.

A proposed budget is attached. Assuming a contract with the new service provider, the cost breaks into eight installments. We estimate a 6% increase for landscape costs. Perhaps we need some modest tree work regarding only a couple of trees. We want to continue mowing and weeding, but no planting. Jim Barnhill will send info about his tree surgeon to Marc and Denise. Gagnon.

We will move forward on the maintenance schedule from last year. If the contract cost does not go up, we will have a small surplus. We might want to conduct more maintenance next year. We also discussed a proposal to keep \$1,000 as a reserve fund. Known variables are landscaping, dues rate, and collection assumptions. (Marc had talked with Echo Hill for comparison. We have eleven who don't pay. Echo Hill has 10% who don't pay or don't pay on time.) Also, we discussed whether we should refer to dues or fees. It was suggested that dues imply option: but fees are assessed and mandatory. The directors decided to keep the fee at \$150.

It was considered whether we should we add a surcharge for people who do not pay on time? One issue is whether dealing with households who do not pay is too much trouble and complicated, because there are only eleven home owners who do not.

There was an extended discussion of credit cards, raising dues, and charging for credit card fees. The board decided to keep the fee at same level, and consider raising dues again in the future. We would need a concrete reason for raising dues.
